What is VES?

The concentration in Visual and Environmental Studies cultivates skills in both the practice and the critical study of the visual arts. Its components include photography, filmmaking, animation, video art, painting, drawing, printmaking and sculpture, as well as film and visual studies, critical theory, and the study of the built environment.

How do I become a concentrator?

There is a quick application process to be a VES concentrator. VES is honors based, so you will need to have a minimum GPA of 3.0, and you need to have taken at least one VES course, or be in the process of taking one, at the time of application submission.

When is the application due and where can I find it?

The application is due **on Thursday, November 3 by 5pm**. You can find it on the VES Web site:
