## AFVS Secondary Field Requirements Checklist

There are 3 secondary field options in Art. Film. and Visual Studies. Each area has its own set of requirements. Students may choose only one of the options listed below.

<u>Studio Art (6 courses)</u>
4 studio courses of the student's choosing in drawing, mixed media, painting, photography, printmaking, sculpture, and video/installation art. At least one must be introductory-level (i.e., double-digit prefix) and at least one must be intermediate/advanced level (i.e. triple-digit prefix). Other production courses in film, video and animation can also count. In addition to 4 studio courses, students must take 2 lectures or seminars in art history or theory, ordinarily offered by the department of Art, Film, and Visual Studies.

## Film/Video (6 courses)

Production courses in filmmaking, video and animation may be arranged in any combination to maximize each student's interests. Requirements include 4 AFVS production courses in film, video or animation; at least one must be introductory-level (i.e., double-digit prefix) and at least one must be intermediate/advanced level (i.e. triple-digit prefix), and 2 courses in the history or theory of these media, ordinarily offered by the department of Art, Film, and Visual Studies.

- The Art of Film (AFVS 70) and 1 other seminar or lecture course in film and visual studies offered in AFVS, such as AFVS 175: Introduction to Media Theories (Fall 2024), HAA 17K: Introduction to Contemporary Art (Fall 2024) or GENED 1145: Global Japanese Cinema (Fall 2024), offered by AFVS affiliated faculty.
- 4 additional AFVS courses in film and visual studies, or if the student prefers, this can include 1 film/video production or studio course.
